Who will benefit most?

- People who are economically disadvantaged
- People who need help applying for social services
- People who need referrals to basic needs, treatment, health, and shelter services
- People in need of job search assistance or who need help identifying job training and educational opportunities

Who is eligible?

- Connecticut residents at least 18 years old
- Individuals must make no more than 150% of the Federal Poverty Level. A case manager will check your program eligibility during your first meeting, and will refer you to someone if it turns out another program would be a better fit.
